

# How Your Money Helps Save Lives!

HorseWorld is the South West's leading equine charity, rescuing, rehabilitating and re-homing approximately 200 unwanted horses, ponies and donkeys every year. HorseWorld relies entirely upon the generosity of the local community to help us raise the £1,500,000 needed yearly to continue our vital work.

A simple hoof pick only costs **50p**

Re-waterproofing a rug costs **£1.75**. With over 150 rugs it soon mounts up!

**£2.50** buys one bale of hay. Our horses munch up to 1 tonne of hay daily!

**£4** will pay for one hay net

**£5** pays for a medical kit containing Equirap (a special bandage) and Animalintex (cotton wool that draws out infection) to last a horse 1 day

Horses with dust allergies require special bedding made from shavings.  
A bale would last a horse 1 week and costs **£6**

**£7** buys 1 tube of sun protection cream

A lead rope and head collar for one horse costs **£8**

We could add a digital thermometer to our medical kit for an extra **£8**

**£10** buys either a muck scoop or pitch fork – important in animal husbandry

For **£11** we can obtain a 'giddy up' rope, used in non-contact training

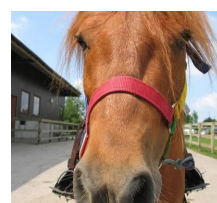
If a stressed horse arrives at HorseWorld it may require a calming supplement. **£14** will pay for one month's treatment

To look their best **£15** will provide six months worth of shampoo!

**£20** can buy Aloe Vera gel to treat sensitive skin

Alternatively one feed bowl costs **£20**

**£25** can give an unwell horse a boost with a course of vitamin complex



**£30** buys a basic grooming kit containing a plastic curry brush, a rubber curry brush, a dandy brush, a mud brush, a body brush and a sweat scraper

Safety is important when training nervous horses.

**£35** will pay for a set of quick release stirrup irons

Each month **£40** is needed to buy a new mineral lick

**£40** would also buy a new drinking trough

Pressure halters are an important part of training and cost **£45**

Neglected horses with muscle wastage need **£48** for a pro-light pad (a type of saddle that bulks up the areas of wastage) until a saddle fits comfortably

Yearly tooth rasping (dental treatment) for one horse costs **£48**

**£48** will buy a new set of horseshoes which will last a horse six weeks

For a year's routine vaccinations, **£60** will keep one horse healthy and fit

To worm a horse for a year can cost over **£70**

**£70** also buys a light-weight turn out rug for milder conditions

For cold weather, a warm and heavy New Zealand rug will cost **£120**

**£152** will buy a basic set of tack for 1 horse, without saddle (includes bridle, girth, stirrups and leather straps, both light and thick saddle cloths)

A Boett rug is breathable and protects against mosquito bites for **£200**

**£400** will feed the horses in our Welfare Department for two weeks

Rehabilitation of a horse can take a long time. **£1,200** will pay for a groom to work with a horse, one hour a day for six months

**£2,800** will pay for a field shelter to be built

Potential new homes need to be checked before the horse is loaned with follow up visits to assess their progress. These visits are carried out by our dedicated volunteers, however the mileage can cost over **£5,000** a year

**£13,300** will cover the stable's fuel bills, providing heat and light for a year
