Help us be there for horses in need

Right now, over 6,000 horses across the UK are at risk of being neglected, and facing an uncertain future. The ongoing economic crisis has left many owners struggling, some desperately seeking help, while others have simply abandoned their animals.

Throughout almost all of 2024, we were over capacity. But when an emergency call comes in, when a horse is in urgent, desperate need, how can we possibly say no? The reality is heartbreaking: so many need us, but we simply don't have the funds or resources to help them all.

One of the many cases we've taken in this year is young foal Taco and his mother, Belle. They were found abandoned on land in Kent, with no one to care for them. Many rescue centres across the country are already stretched to their limits, but we were able to step in and give them a safe place to recover. Belle arrived malnourished, and little Taco had already had a rough start in life. With your support, they're now receiving specialist food, round-the-clock care, and vital veterinary treatment. And with Belle pregnant, ongoing care will be essential to ensure a brighter future for them all.



But it's not just abandoned horses who need us. More and more owners have been reaching out in crisis, struggling to keep up with the rising cost of living. For many, it's not just one thing that tips the balance, it's the accumulation of financial pressures, an unexpected illness, or a sudden change in circumstances that leaves them with no other option but to ask for help.

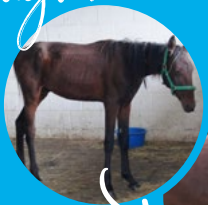

From Neglect to a Loving Home

In 2015, Dakota was rescued from one of the most heartbreaking cases of neglect we had ever seen.

Dakota was part of a group of feral horses struggling to survive, living in fields alongside dead animals, having never known the kindness of human touch. When she arrived, she was pregnant and caring for a foal at her side. While her first foal was successfully weaned, heartbreakingly, the one she later gave birth to did not survive.

At first, we thought Dakota was an elderly mare. Her frail body and defeated spirit made her look far older than her years. But once our dentist was finally able to assess her, we were stunned to learn she was just 2–3 years old. This revelation made her transformation even more remarkable.

Dakota's rehabilitation was a slow and patient journey. She had to learn to trust, to feel safe, and to accept the gentle presence of people in her life. It wasn't always easy, but with time, care, and unwavering dedication, Dakota blossomed into a confident and curious pony.

She formed an incredible bond with her groom, who taught her tricks and agility skills, turning them into a wonderful duo that delighted visitors with their performances at our Open Days!

And then, the day we had all dreamed of finally arrived. Dakota was ready to take the next step, to find a forever home with a loving family to call her own. She was spotted on our website by Lauren Lounton and her partner, Kayleigh.

Lauren explains: "After the loss of our beloved pony, Lizzie, we felt a significant void in our lives. Both Kayleigh and I were naturally inclined to rehome a rescue animal, as we have ample time and love to offer to an animal in need. We independently discovered Dakota on HorseWorld's rehoming page and felt an immediate connection. The team at HorseWorld were incredibly kind and welcoming, making the entire process seamless.

"When Dakota arrived home, she was initially shy and reserved. It took over a week to get close to her, with snacks helping to ease the process. She has seamlessly integrated into our lives, as if she was meant to be with us. In a short period, she has taught us the value of patience, rewarding us with boundless love. Dakota now enjoys her days alongside her friend, Hope, and loves going on long walks. We have no expectations from this special girl; she simply gets to be a horse.

We extend our heartfelt gratitude to HorseWorld for entrusting us with Dakota. We love her unconditionally and cannot imagine our lives without her."

Thinking back to the wild and frightened youngster she once was, it's hard to believe just how far she has come. Dakota's story is a true testament to the power of patience, kindness, and second chances.

Thank you to everyone who supports our rescue efforts. Because of you, beautiful souls like Dakota get the happy endings they deserve.

Keeping track

At HorseWorld, we currently have three different track systems; a hilly track for weight loss and muscle building, a flat track for laminitic and senior equines, and a Shetland track for our smaller residents.

At HorseWorld, we've embraced track systems to keep our equines moving, healthy, and happy! We have three:

- **Hilly Track**

For weight loss & muscle-building.

- **Flat Track**

Ideal for senior & laminitic horses.

- **Shetland Track**

Perfect for our smallest residents.



Why use a track system?

A track follows a field's perimeter, encouraging movement and natural foraging. This helps manage weight and reduces the risk of laminitis.

Setting up your own track

- Invest in sturdy fencing & place water troughs far apart to encourage movement.
- Add variety, hills, logs, scratching posts & rolling areas.
- Consider herd dynamics, wider tracks help prevent dominance issues.
- Manage grazing, use hay or controlled access to grass.

Rehoming inspiration

One of the best parts? Potential rehomers visiting HorseWorld get to see these tracks in action. Watching horses thrive in their natural herd environment often inspires adopters to create similar setups at home, helping more horses live healthier and happier lives

Rehoming



Rehomer, Adrienne Mitchell has created her own track system for rehomed ponies Dodger and Doris; she tells us about the experience.

It's been a wonderful journey to adopting our beloved Doris and Dodger! It all began when my husband and I moved to the countryside and settled in a small village near Monmouth. It had always been our dream to retire to the countryside once our four children had all grown up and we soon settled into our new rural lifestyle.

We had purchased a property with an adjacent field with nearly 2 acres of land and we immediately wanted to adopt some Shetland ponies as my husband had owned Shetlands in the past and I had loved horse riding as a young girl. We contacted HorseWorld and Rehoming Coordinator, Georgia sent us photographs of Doris and Dodger. Shortly after, we went to visit them and fell in love at first sight!

Both ponies had such wonderful temperaments and we could clearly see what a fabulous job all the staff had done at HorseWorld to socialise them.

Georgia went through all the necessary steps which enabled us to set up a track system in our field and ensure we were thoroughly prepared for their arrival. Then, at the beginning of July, with the help of our neighbour and her horsebox, we picked up the ponies and Doris and Dodger moved into their new home. They have now been living with us for just over nine months and they are truly part of our animal family! We look forward to many more years of fun with Doris and Dodger – thank you HorseWorld once again for helping them become such well balanced animals!

They met Hercules, a basic yet responsive simulator, before testing the high-tech Mark 10 Racing Simulator, which provided a thrilling experience – especially for facilitator Kayleigh, who might be Grand National-ready!

The highlight was Margaret, the UK's first Racewood Eventing Simulator, offering Grand Prix dressage, show jumping, and cross-country experiences.

Now inspired, the Discovery team hopes to introduce a simulator into their programme – stay tuned!

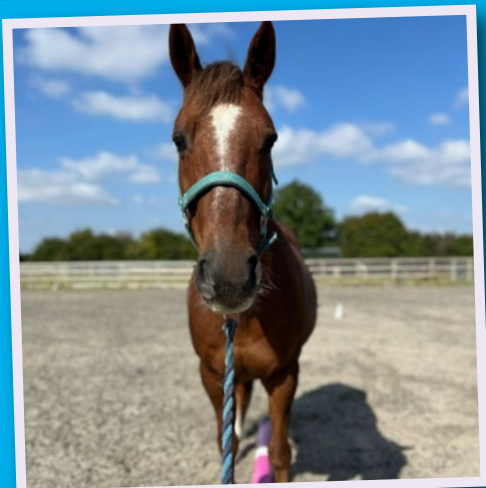
