You may remember just a few months ago we appealed to you, our brilliant supporters, for your urgent help. We had taken in five frightened and malnourished ponies after receiving an urgent call to help with a major rescue operation involving multiple rescue charities.

The ponies came to us in a terrible condition. They were starving and so very scared. After spending time in our Isolation Unit to rest and recover, our team set about very gently trying to gain the trust of these petrified little ponies.

Once the test results showed they were not carrying anything contagious, and when our welfare team judged the time to be right, the little herd was moved into a paddock closer to the yard to help them become used to the day-to-day activities of our busy site. Every day, multiple people, horses and vehicles go past. These new experiences are helping the ponies become more comfortable with their surroundings and in turn making them less fearful.

We have already noticed that in just a few weeks their courage has increased and so too has their curiosity. When walking past their paddock, they sometimes approach the fence to get a closer look at you, turning their head and extending their nose to get a good sniff.

Take a look at this photo for example. Georgia, one of our Welfare grooms, was spending time in the pony's field to gain their trust. Whilst Georgia was making sure her body language was relaxed, Pretzel and Peanut decided to approach her for a gentle scratch. This may seem like a minor interaction, but this is a huge breakthrough for these once-terrified ponies.

You all responded so generously to our appeal for help. The monies raised will help secure a future for these ponies who still have a very long road ahead of them, and there's no way of knowing what's around the corner, but thanks to you we'll be with them every step of the way.

Discovery / polate

The last academic year has seen our team work with over 300 young people as well as staff training and continual professional development.

The NHS estimate that around one in six young people have a probable mental health disorder. Therefore, it's more important than ever that we keep up to date with the latest research so we can support the mental health of our students by giving them the social and emotional skills they need to thrive in life. This means understanding each pupil as an individual and tailoring both group and one-to-one provision to meet each child's specific requirements.

In addition, Facilitators and grooms have attended Intelligent Horsemanship (IH) training as part of HorseWorld's development programme and investment in continual professional development. This means that all staff are now using the IH strategy when working with the horses.



The summer holidays provide our team with a good opportunity to plan activities for the next academic year and to spend some quality time with our horses.

The focus has been on helping our equine friends stay at a healthy weight which can be a challenge with the lush grass. We are looking forward to introducing some new horses and ponies into the Discovery programme in the upcoming year including Beth and Odette.

The whole Discovery team are excited to welcome students back after the summer holidays. With new topics in place for our students including obstacles to learning, our facilitators are working hard to support students through the change of academic year which can often be a challenging time.

Following facilitator and referrer feedback, HorseWorld Discovery learning offer is now based around a twelve-week programme. The benefit of a longer intervention will support the students to manage their time when back in their educational setting. It will also give students more time to build a trusting relationship with HorseWorld Facilitators and achieve strategies to support their barriers to learning.

HorseWorld Discovery is continuing to evolve; providing greater impact for the young people that attend the programme.

Can you help feed the HorseWorld Herd?

We've noticed a dramatic increase in the number of horses being abandoned across the South West over the last year and with the Winter approaching we are appealing for help to buy hay.



This year, we've received a record number of calls to our equine welfare team with owners increasingly desperate to re-home horses due to the combination of the credit crunch and the increasing cost of feed.

It seems that the economic climate and the spiralling cost of hay is pushing owners to desperate lengths, and we are seeing an increase in owners operating on a shoe-string who can no longer cope. As a result HorseWorld are being asked to take in more horses and this has impact on our costs. particularly at this time of year.

We are operating at capacity and carefully plan for our winter feed supplies but with the increasing prices we find ourselves appealing for extra

support this Winter.

HorseWorld provides a home for life for over 100 horses on our farm in Whitchurch. The extreme weather patterns of a heatwave in spring meant that the normal grass supplies in the paddock were sparse, followed by the rain downpours which flooded land and meant we were unable to produce our own hav.

The Hay for HorseWorld appeal has been set up on line to help raise funds to continue to care for all our horses and donkeys during the Winter

£5 could help us buy one bale of hay, £10 could help buy two bales of hay whilst £20 will ensure a Shire horse like Lolly receives hay every day for a week.
