That's why our Feed the Herd appeal is so important, anything you can donate towards the incremental £15,000 feed bill will make a difference. Together, I know we can keep every horse safe and well-fed.

It was with huge sadness that due to an outbreak of an equine respiratory infection called Strep Zoo on site, we had to cancel our annual Open Day. It was heart-breaking as we were looking forward to seeing you, but protecting the health of the rescued horses, ponies and donkeys in our care must always come first.

Thankfully, due to the expertise and dedication of our amazing welfare team and our vets the horses with Strep Zoo have recovered and life has returned to normal.

However, our Open Day is our biggest fundraising event of the year. It helps us raise vital funds needed to continue rescuing, rehabilitating, and rehoming horses in desperate need. We have around 100 horses in our care at any one time, each one relying on us, and on your support, every single day.

HorseWorld's Groundbreaking Study Helps Tackle Equine Obesity



In the last newsletter we talked about our track systems at HorseWorld. Now we're pleased to update that our scientific research into the use of track systems for weight loss, in partnership with Hartpury University, has been peer reviewed and published.

Working with the university, our team set out to explore new ways to tackle the growing issue of equine obesity. The study focused on the use of track systems, a type of grazing setup we've been using successfully at HorseWorld for over a decade to help manage weight and health. Although track systems have become more popular in recent years, there's been little scientific research to support their benefits until now.

To guide the project, we enlisted the help of Equine Welfare Consultant Kate Fletcher and followed 19 horses with varying health needs, all prone to weight gain. The horses were split into two groups. Some kept in traditional paddocks, and others on the track system. The results were clear; horses on the track system lost more weight, with no negative effects on their behaviour, hoof health or welfare. This research provides reassurance and guidance for anyone caring for horses prone to obesity, helping horses everywhere live happier, healthier lives.

The creation of the track systems at HorseWorld was made possible thanks to a grant from the Pets Foundation, a charity established by Pets at Home in 2006, dedicated to making a difference to pets and people.

We're proud to support the incredible work of HorseWorld by funding their track system. These systems improve the wellbeing of the horses in their care and has been shown through their subsequent study that track systems directly tackle equine obesity. From HAY to PLAY

How Enrichment is Transforming the Lives of Rescued Horses

We believe that every horse deserves more than just safety, they deserve happiness, fulfilment, and the chance to thrive. That's why we're thrilled to share the findings of another study we've completed, From Hay to Play, which explores how environmental enrichment can dramatically improve the wellbeing of horses.

Many of the horses and ponies who come into our care have faced trauma, neglect, and fear. While providing food, shelter, and veterinary care is vital, we know that true healing goes beyond physical recovery. This groundbreaking study was carried out by our dedicated welfare team to find out how simple changes in our equines environment could positively impact their behaviour and emotional wellbeing.

Using a variety of enrichment techniques such as treat-dispensing toys, herbal foraging balls, scratching posts, and sensory stimulation, the study closely monitored the responses of horses and ponies in our care. The results were inspiring.



We observed more calm, relaxed behaviours, reduced signs of stress, and a greater display of natural behaviours like exploration and play. In some cases, enrichment even helped build trust in previously nervous horses, opening the door for them to take the next step in their rehabilitation journey.

Thanks to this study, enrichment is now built into the daily routine at HorseWorld; not as a luxury, but as a key part of recovery. The insights we've gained will help us continue to tailor our care to the individual needs of each horse, helping them rediscover joy after hardship.

This research has been shared with other equine welfare professionals to promote best practice across the sector, meaning your support is having an even wider impact on horse welfare than you might realise.

Jubilee's story began in the summer of 2012 when she was born at HorseWorld. Her name marked a double celebration; the Queen's Diamond Jubilee and our own 60th anniversary. Her mother had been rescued as part of a large group of neglected, pregnant mares; an example of indiscriminate breeding at a UK 'foal farm'.

Thankfully, Jubilee was born healthy, and her mum made a full recovery as a result of the care and kindness she received here at HorseWorld.

As Jubilee grew, she blossomed into a gentle, dependable and kind mare and so joined our Discovery team, supporting vulnerable young people through Equine Assisted Learning. She was also one of our much-loved Sponsorship horses.

After years of giving so much to others, it was time for Jubilee to enjoy a slower pace of life. She went on temporary loan to Becky, one of our grooms, for some well-earned rest and relaxation. Helping Becky care for Jubilee was Phoebe who was a familiar face not just to Jubilee, but to HorseWorld. Years ago, Phoebe had been a Discovery student herself, struggling with confidence. Jubilee was the horse she bonded with, and today their story has come full-circle with Phoebe giving Jubilee a new home.

"Jubilee inspired me to apply to college and follow my dream of working with horses," said Phoebe "Now I'm a full-time groom at HorseWorld and I've given Jubilee her forever home."

To see both Phoebe and Jubilee thriving together, is the perfect ending to their shared journey. Thanks to your support, stories like theirs are possible.

BENTLEY'S BIG SLIM-DOWN

Rehomed from HorseWorld, Bentley has been on an inspiring weight-loss journey with his devoted rehomer, Debbie. After sadly losing her mare Layla to Laminitis and EMS, Debbie knew just how important it was to get Bentley to a healthy weight.

Back in June 2024, Bentley tipped the scales at a worrying 567kg. But thanks to Debbie's dedication, smart feeding, and a carefully managed exercise routine, he's now down to a healthy 426kg and he's feeling fantastic!

Our home visitor Georgia visited Bentley and Debbie more regularly to support and check-in with Bentley's weight loss journey. Using a weigh-tape and teaching our rehomers about Body Scoring is an effective way to help them monitor their horses weight.

Georgia's visits included discussions about exercise plans and nutrition. Debbie would then weigh out and soak Bentley's hay rations to the appropriate amounts for weight loss and also included a supplement to ensure Bentley's diet is balanced (which is important when their diets are restricted in any way).



Debbie was also invited to our rehomers event in 2024 which focussed on track systems. She implemented a track for Bentley and his friend Frankie which has been brilliant at keeping Bentley moving. Debbie has been really proactive putting our recommendations into place and is inventive with his exercise regime keeping it varied and engaging for him.

Bentley has gone from dangerously overweight to fit and fabulous. He's now had the all-clear from the vet to be training as a ridden horse.

We know how tricky weight management can be, especially during summer when grass is usually rich in sugar. That's why we're always here to offer help and advice to our amazing rehomers. Because without them, our rescued horses wouldn't have the second chances they so deserve.

Huge congratulations to Bentley and a heartfelt thank you to Debbie for giving him such a loving and knowledgeable home!

Taco and Belle

You may remember beautiful Belle and her adorable foal Taco from our Spring newsletter.

They were rescued by us in January this year after being abandoned; both innocent victims of indiscriminate breeding. Poor Belle was so thin from not only feeding Taco, but also the unborn foal she was carrying.

We're really pleased to share that Belle gave birth to a healthy foal in May, who we have named Nacho. Despite her difficult past, Belle has been an incredible mum and little Nacho is already melting hearts.

When we first met Belle and Taco, they were frightened, malnourished, and had clearly never known kindness from people. But thanks to your support, they've received the expert care, love, and time they desperately needed to begin trusting again.

All three will have a lifetime of safety and security from HorseWorld. Ponies like these can live well into their thirties so we have a big responsibility for their immediate care and for many years to come.

By rescuing two ponies, we've saved the lives of three – but every hungry tummy needs to be filled and our resources are already stretched due to the effect the extreme weather has had on grass in our fields. We're having to feed hay reserved for the winter, and the situation is only going to get worse.

Thank you for helping us give these animals the security and opportunities they deserve.

Appeal

Right now, we are facing one of the toughest challenges in our 73 year history. The grass in our fields has withered under months of extreme weather, leaving our 100+ rescued horses, ponies and donkeys with little to graze.

Every day, our team is distributing more than 500kg of hay across 180 acres just to keep the herd fed and healthy. Normally over the summer months, hay would only be a small overnight supplement to those who needed additional nutrition. This summer, it became a lifeline, and the strain is immense.

Last year we were able to harvest 87 bales of hay from our own fields. This year, we managed just 22. The knock-on effects of last winter's prolonged rain, late spring growth, and this summer's exceptional dry spell mean there was simply no grass. The fields were little more than dust and dried stalks.

A single bale, weighing just over half a tonne, now costs £75 and we know the price is going to rise.

With over 100 hungry mouths to feed, these costs will quickly spiral beyond anything we could have prepared for.

This isn't just a short-term crisis. Even with the recent rainfall, the damage is done. We are having to feed grass nuts, sugar beet, and extra nutrition, to those who need the most support in their rehabilitation.

We are bracing ourselves for months ahead where hay, feed, and straw will be at a premium. And every new rescue we take in adds to the demand.



We are anticipating our hay bill costing an extra £15,000-£18,000 this year. That's on top of our usual bills!

STARVATION to *New life*

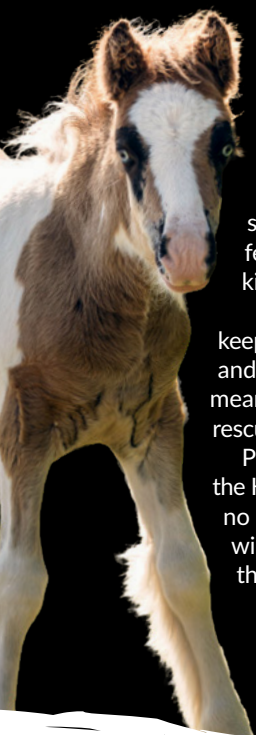

But this miracle comes at a cost. More mouths to feed, more hay, more specialist nutrition, all at a time when resources are already stretched to the limit. Every bag of feed, every bale of hay, every act of kindness makes a difference.

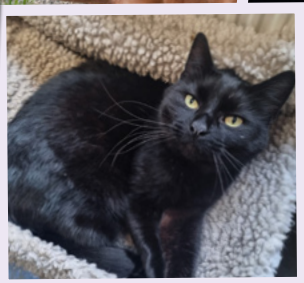
He's now joined our Discovery team, where he supports children and young people as they build confidence, develop emotional resilience, and discover their own strength, just like Bertie has.

For nearly 75 years, HorseWorld has been a team of People helping Horses, helping People. We are dedicated to the rescue and rehabilitation of horses, and increasing their relevance to society. And we want to continue doing that for the next 75 years, so please help us shape that future by sharing your ideas for a Future HorseWorld.

Each year we take care of over 100 neglected or abandoned animals at HorseWorld with responsibility for a further 200 previously rescued horses now living in loan homes across the South West. Unfortunately more horses need our help, welfare reports rose by 93% in 2024, with more horses arriving after being given up by owners who could no longer cope.

Alongside this, our Discovery programme supports vulnerable children and young people who are struggling in education or with their emotional wellbeing. In the past two years alone, Discovery has reached almost 500 young people and delivered over 4,300 hours of teaching, helping them to build skills, confidence and brighter futures, but there are hundreds more needing our help.

As we look ahead to our centenary in 2052, we know demand for our work will continue to rise. More horses are in crisis, and more children are facing long waits for support with their learning and mental health. To meet this need, HorseWorld is exploring how we can expand our work to deliver our mission for decades to come.

Project 2052 is about creating a pathway for the Future HorseWorld, and we want your help to shape that future.
